Patriotism. Above all DeMolay teaches its young men to be loyal to their government and to respect the law.

Cleanliness in thought, word and deed are goals a DeMolay is taught to pursue throughout life, along with a great respect for women. One of the lectures of DeMolay teaches a profound appreciation for womanhood and especially motherhood.

The virtue of Comradeship teaches young men the importance of being able to relate to one's fellow man on equal terms. In addition to these lessons, DeMolay also teaches its young men to have respect for parents and compassion for the elderly and less fortunate by never allowing a meeting to close without offering a prayer on their behalf.

In conclusion, I ask you, my Brethren, do we need DeMolay? Aren't these the kind of individuals we would like to see petition our Fraternity? I think the answer to these questions is yes, we most certainly need DeMolay to reaffirm the basic fundamentals

of our youth and to create better citizens for the future of mankind and for the future of Freemasonry.

And DeMolay needs us. Without our help and guidance there will be no more DeMolay Chapters.
